BOARD MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

The Massachusetts APSE board provides oversight of chapter activities and determines what areas the chapter will focus on. As a volunteer organization, chapter board members are expected to dedicate time, energy, and ideas to organize and implement chapter activities. Individuals serving on the MA-APSE Board must:

- Have demonstrated interest and involvement in integrated community-based employment for citizens with disabilities.

- Participate in monthly board and committee meetings (either in-person or by phone/on-line).
- Chair and/or serve on chapter committees, based on the board members' interests. Current committees include: communications, conference & training, membership, public policy.
- ➤ Have sufficient time to fully participate in all board activities, and actively contribute and assist with the ongoing development and growth of MA-APSE as an organization. Board membership requires a commitment of approximately 3 to 5 hours per month.
